UM SAFE APP

UM Safe is an essential tool that sends safety alerts and provides instant access to campus safety resources. The app includes features such as “Work Alone” and “FriendWalk”, as well as a Mobile BlueLight feature similar to the stationary blue lights on our campuses.

Some of the app features involve interaction with Security Services, and some will be optional — while other features have no interaction with Security Services.

Used by hundreds of higher education institutions and millions of people around the globe, the app was developed by App Armor and is custom branded for the U of M.

The free mobile safety app for students, staff, and faculty is available for iPhone (App Store) and Android (Play Store) devices.

The Mobile BlueLight button will only contact Security Services when the person is within the campus Safe Walk boundaries. If outside of the Safe Walk boundaries, the Mobile BlueLight notification will go to 911.

PERSONAL SAFETY

Generally speaking, Winnipeg is a safe place to live. Nonetheless, whether at home, on campus, or around the city, everyone should be aware and consider their personal safety.

SAFETY TIPS

- » Plan to use the safest and most direct route when travelling to your destination while on campus. Walk with a friend or consider contacting the University of Manitoba Security Services for a SAFEWALK.
- » Avoid isolated areas, alleyways, and places with low visibility at night.
- » When walking, ensure that you are not wearing headphones or electronic devices that can distract you.
- » Avoid being intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.
- » When walking, appear confident and always be aware of your surroundings.
- » When walking around the city, be conscious of the weather and dress and prepare accordingly.



- » If it appears that you are being followed or you feel threatened for any reason, immediately run away and shout to attract attention. Be sure to contact Security Services on campus or 911 off campus immediately.
- » Refrain from carrying an excessive amount of cash and ensure your personal belongings, such as your purse, backpack, and laptop, are always close to you.
- » When at home or residence, ensure that your doors and windows are always locked, including your vehicle doors, to prevent someone from breaking in.
- » When working alone on campus, use the UM Safe App and ensure your unit has a working-alone plan.

Suspicious

Safe Walk/Safe Ride

Safe Walk and Safe Ride is a free service in which Security Services staff will meet and walk you or give you a ride to/from your car, class, residence room, or bus stop. If you do not feel comfortable walking on campus, Security Services would be happy to assist you.
